Prerequisite: Must be 18 years of age and have a high school diploma or equivalent; and currently active as a fire investigator or have duties assigned; and evidence of training to NFPA 1033 and 921; and evidence of a background check conducted by local law enforcement; and recommendation of agency having jurisdiction or employer; and Hazardous Material Awareness training to NFPA 472, 2-2.1 to 2-2.3, evidence of courtroom testimony tested or Washington-State approved courtroom testimony course.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

The evaluator must be third party certified through the Washington State Certified Evaluator Program. Following the Bureau Certification Guideline, an instructor is not allowed to evaluate the candidate he/she instructed. A minimum of two evaluators is required for retesting purposes.
